2.3. Other hazards

Refrigerated solidified gas. Contact with product may cause cold burns or frostbite.
In high concentrations CO₂ causes rapid circulatory insufficiency even at normal levels of oxygen concentration. Symptoms are headache, nausea and vomiting, which may lead to unconsciousness and death.

- Specific hazards : Exposure to fire may cause containers to rupture/explode.

5.3. Advice for firefighters

Cool endangered receptacles with water spray jet from a protected position. Prevent water used in emergency cases from entering sewers and drainage systems.

SECTION 7: Handling and storage

7.1. Precautions for safe handling

- Safe use of the product : For more guidance on safe use, refer to the EIGA Doc.150 "Code of practice Dry Ice" downloadable at <http://www.eiga.eu>. and consult your supplier.
The product must be handled in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety procedures.
Only experienced and properly instructed persons should handle gases under pressure.
Consider pressure relief device(s) in gas installations.
Ensure the complete gas system was (or is regularly) checked for leaks before use.
Do not smoke while handling product.
Use only properly specified equipment which is suitable for this product, its supply pressure and temperature. Contact your gas supplier if in doubt.
Avoid suck back of water, acid and alkalis.
Do not breathe gas.
Avoid release of product into atmosphere.
- Safe handling of the gas receptacle : Refer to supplier's container handling instructions.
Do not allow backfeed into the container.
Protect containers from physical damage; do not drag, roll, slide or drop.
When moving cylinders, even for short distances, use a cart (trolley, hand truck, etc.) designed to transport cylinders.
Leave valve protection caps in place until the container has been secured against either a wall or bench or placed in a container stand and is ready for use.

8.2. Exposure controls

8.2.1. Appropriate engineering controls

Systems under pressure should be regularly checked for leakages.
Ensure exposure is below occupational exposure limits (where available).

SECTION 11: Toxicological information

11.1. Information on toxicological effects

Acute toxicity	: Unlike simple asphyxiants, carbon dioxide has the ability to cause death even when normal oxygen levels (20-21%) are maintained. 5% CO ₂ has been found to act synergistically to increase the toxicity of certain other gases (CO, NO ₂). CO ₂ has been shown to enhance the production of carboxy- or met-hemoglobin by these gases possibly due to carbon dioxide's stimulatory effects on the respiratory and circulatory systems.
